"Far From A New Dawn Of Broad-Based Growth, America's Middle Class Decline Is Getting Worse." "Second, the hollowing out of America's middle class – still politely described as median income stagnation rather than 'decline' – is accelerating rather than slowing. According to the US Census last week, the US median household is 4.8 per cent poorer now than at the start of the recovery in 2009. Median incomes have now fallen to the pre-internet level of 1993. All of the gains of the Clinton years have been lost.
