McAuliffe Hired Anthony Rodham, Hillary Clinton's Brother, To Oversee Investor Recruitment For GreenTech. "Mr. McAuliffe's GreenTech career — he resigned as chairman last December to focus on his campaign — fits a pattern of tying into the Clinton network. His old friend Bill Clinton attended the ribbon cutting at GreenTech's Mississippi plant in July 2012. Mr. McAuliffe hired Anthony Rodham, Mrs. Clinton's younger brother, to oversee investor recruitment." A former senior employee said Mr. Rodham was almost never in the office, a glass tower next to the Tysons Galleria mall here in Northern Virginia." Hillary Clinton's 2008 Presidential Campaign Received \$608,000 In Undisclosed Assistance From A Single Politically-Connected Businessman

D.C. Businessman Jeffrey Thompson Paid New York Marketing Executive Troy White \$608,000 To Conduct Undisclosed Get-Out-The-Vote Operations For Hillary Clinton In Multiple States. "Jeffrey E. Thompson, a former city contractor who allegedly financed a secret campaign for then-mayoral candidate Vincent C. Gray (D) in 2010, financed an independent effort to reach urban voters on behalf of Clinton in Texas and at least three other states during the 2008 Democratic primaries, according to the interviews and documents. Thompson allegedly paid Troy White, a New York marketing executive, more than \$608,000 to hire "street teams" to distribute posters, stickers and yard signs beginning in February 2008 to help raise Clinton's profile during her primary battle with then-Sen. Barack Obama, according to the documents and interviews with several people familiar with the investigation." In 1997, The Senate Investigated Whether The Clinton Re-Election Campaign Had Illegally Engineered A Contribution Swap With The Teamsters. “The Senate committee investigating allegations of campaign fund-raising abuses turned its attention for the first time yesterday to the possibility that funds from the International Brotherhood of Teamsters were improperly directed into the Clinton-Gore reelection effort last year. The panel's chairman, Sen. Fred D. The DNC's Former Finance Director Testified In Federal Court That McAuliffe Had Played “A Major Role” In The Scheme. “A former Democratic official has testified that Terence McAuliffe, President Clinton's friend and chief fund-raiser, played a major role in promoting an illegal scheme in which Democratic donors were to contribute to the Teamster president's re-election campaign, and in exchange the Teamsters were to donate large sums to the Democrats. The official, Richard Sullivan, the Democratic National Committee's former finance director, testified in Manhattan at the trial of William Hamilton, the Teamsters former political director, that Mr. McAuliffe urged him and other fund-raisers to find a rich Democrat to donate at least \$50,000 to the 1996 re-election campaign of Ron Carey, the former Teamsters president. McAuliffe Acknowledged Discussing A Potential Swap Of Campaign Funds, Saying “You Help Me, I’ll Help You. That’s Politics.” “This year, Mr. McAuliffe’s role in a questionable plan to swap contributions in 1996 by the Teamsters union and the Democratic Party surfaced during the federal trial in New York of the former political director of the union, who was convicted of fraud and conspiracy. Mr. McAuliffe, in an interview, acknowledged discussing a potential swap. ‘You help me, I’ll help you. That’s politics,’ he said.
